About the Webinar: Zotero is open-source software developed specifically for researchers. It is designed to help users “collect, organize, cite, and share research.” Zotero helps researchers organize the way they search and collect information, while providing a means to quickly and easily cite the source of their findings. This webinar will discuss how genealogists can utilize its capabilities to easily catalog sources, compile research notes, create citations, and more.



Patti Lee Hobbs, CG®, lives in rural southwest Missouri and is blessed to have ancestors from many geographical locations including North Carolina! She serves on the editorial board for the *National Genealogical Society Quarterly* and is trustee for both the Board for Certification of Genealogists and the BCG Education Fund.
