Speakers

John Beatty, CG®



John D. Beatty, CG, has been a Senior Librarian in The Genealogy Center since 1984 and also serves as its principal bibliographer. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree with high honors in History from the University of Michigan in 1982, and a Master of Arts degree in History and Library Science with honors from that university in 1984. He became a Board-certified genealogist in 2014. He is the author of sixteen books on local and family history, including works on German and early American families, abstracts of town vital records from Biddeford, Maine, and annotated narratives from the Irish Rebellion of 1798, as well as numerous articles on a variety of genealogical and local historical topics. In

2006, he served as principal editor for volume one of a two-volume History of Fort Wayne and Allen County, Indiana, 1700-2005, the first history of Allen County produced since 1917. Because of a diversified family background, he has genealogical expertise in a variety of areas. He has conducted original research on families from colonial New England, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, the Carolinas, and Kentucky, as well as on seventeenth- and eighteenth-century families from Ireland, Germany and Switzerland. He serves as archivist for the Episcopal Diocese of Northern Indiana, and his interests also include local Fort Wayne and Allen County history.

Debra M. Dudek is head of Adult and Teen Services at the Fountaindale Public Library District in Bolingbrook, Illinois. She holds a post-graduate certificate in genealogical, paleographic, and heraldic studies from the University of Strathclyde in Glasgow, Scotland. Ms. Dudek is the book review editor of the Illinois State Genealogical Society, a board member of the Illinois State Historical Society, and the author of the *World War I Research Guide: Tracing American Military and Non-Combatant Ancestors*.

Janice Lovelace, PhD



Janice Lovelace, Ph.D. is a genealogical researcher, educator, author and lecturer, with over thirty years of experience. She completed the Genealogy and Family History certificate at University of Washington in 2012, the certificate program in genealogy at Boston University in 2013 and ProGen in 2014. Dr. Lovelace is a frequent speaker at international, national and regional genealogy conferences as well as local societies on health and genetics, ethnic minority genealogy, and research methodology. She is an instructor at the Midwest African American Genealogical Institute (MAAGI). A retired

college faculty member, Dr Lovelace authored the National Genealogical Society's online continuing education course *African American Roots: A Historical Perspective*. A freelance writer and photographer, she has a number of genealogy articles among her publications. She has been a national board member of the Association of Professional Genealogists (2019-2020) and has served on her local society's board. She belongs to the National Genealogical Society (NGS) and local societies. In her work life, Dr. Lovelace is a licensed clinical psychologist and has been a private practice therapist.

Jill Morelli, Certified Genealogist® and Certified Genealogy Lecturer, presents on intermediate and advanced methodologies, unique record sets, Swedish research, and writing family histories.
