These two morning sessions begin with an overview of foundational principles in understanding autosomal DNA inheritance. Then the use of both DNA-company and third-party tools demonstrates logical processes to identify and confirm ancestors. These sessions focus on different methods and sequences in using DNA with documentary evidence.</p>

1:30 - 2:30	<p>Better Together: Making Your Case with Documents and DNA The genealogical proof standard requires reasonably exhaustive research in solving ancestral-identity problems. DNA evidence is now often part of that research. Even the best DNA evidence must be combined with some traditional research. This session will show different ways that genealogical problems have been solved by integrating DNA evidence with the paper trail.</p>

3:00 - 4:00	<p>Evaluating Conflicting Evidence Have you ever wondered how or if you'll ever determine the "right" answer to your genealogical question? Evidence evaluation requires understanding the records and how they were created as well as correlating the evidence. This session presents an overview of the evidence-evaluation process using example case studies.</p>
